

SUMMER READING PROGRAM



We feel a summer reading program can be both beneficial and enjoyable for our students. The following are some steps toward what we hope will be enjoyable summer reading.

1. In order to provide a variety of reading, we ask that students select books from the following “different” categories. Let’s put “Dewey Decimal” to work. Select a variety from the following categories and remember, do not limit yourself to just one category:

Fiction	Non-Fiction
Mystery	Biography
Fairy Tale/Myth	Autobiography
Sports	Science/Religion
Novels	History

2. Each grade level student is asked to read a minimum number of books, but is in NO WAY LIMITED to that number.

Entering grade 1, 2 and 3	3 books
Entering grade 4 and 5	4 books
Entering Grade 6	See separate flier, enclosed
Entering Grade 7	See separate flier, enclosed
Entering Grade 8	See Separate flier, enclosed

3. Included in this packet is a form for each child (grades 1-5) to keep track of summer reading books. Parents are asked to sign their name in the space provided.
4. No book reports are required. Upon their return to school, students will be asked to do an “in-class” book report on one of the books read during the summer.
5. Your local librarian will be glad to help select books for appropriate grade levels and variety. Additionally, your child may enjoy some of the local library programs offered throughout the summer.
